**3. Question:** Please describe the support team and who will be the key players in the project.

Response: The On Street Division will be the primary users of this product. In particular, the On Street analysts would use this product to GIS all curb assets along with conducting parking studies. The Authority is a large organization with many qualified support staff.

**4. Question:** What are the benchmarks that will determine success for the project?

Response: Ease of use. Integration with existing applications and systems. Data sharing capabilities. Ownership of data. The RFI identifies the criteria.
