

# LEMON HILL RESIDENT NOTICE

## FIFA WORLD CUP 26™ PARKING CHANGES

### Residential Parking Access Only

To support the FIFA World Cup 26™ Fan Festival at Lemon Hill, temporary parking restrictions will be in place to protect neighborhood access.

**June 11 – July 19, 2026**

Only vehicles with approved residential permits (no cost) may park on neighborhood streets. No general event parking will be allowed.

### HOW TO GET YOUR TEMPORARY PERMIT:

**There is no cost to obtain the temporary residential permit.**

**Current permit holders are not exempt. Your vehicle must have a temporary permit to avoid being ticketed and towed.**

- Philadelphia Parking Authority Permit Office: 35 N. 8th Street

### WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- Proof of Residency
  - (Lease, utility bill, or PA driver's license)
- Vehicle Registration
  - (For each vehicle needing a permit)

### WHAT YOU'LL RECEIVE:

- Virtual Residential Permits (No Cost)
- Your license plate will be registered digitally
- Two (2) Visitor Day Passes Per Household
  - For guests or service vehicles
  - No vehicle? You still qualify for visitor passes



### ENFORCEMENT & IMPACT

- Increased patrols
- Resident-only parking
- No festival parking permitted

### BUSINESSES:

- Businesses within the temporary permit district will be provided with ten (10) visitor day pass hangtags.

## FIFA WORLD CUP 26™ PARKING CHANGES

### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

#### **Who needs a temporary residential parking permit?**

Any vehicle parked on the street within the Lemon Hill residential area during the enforcement period from June 11 through July 19, 2026, must have an approved temporary residential permit.

#### **What if I already have a residential parking permit? Do I still need to get the temporary permit?**

Yes. Any vehicle parked on the street within the Lemon Hill residential area during the enforcement period must obtain a temporary parking permit, which is free.

#### **What if I don't obtain a temporary parking permit?**

Vehicles parked without temporary permits on designated streets will be subject to ticketing and towing.

#### **How do I apply for a permit?**

Residents may apply online through the PPA website or in person at the Philadelphia Parking Authority. Permit Office at 35 N. 8th St., Philadelphia, PA 19106.

#### **What documents will I need to upload?**

You will need proof of residency and a current Pennsylvania vehicle registration card for each vehicle that needs a permit.

#### **What if I get a parking ticket while having a temporary permit?**

#### **What can I use as proof of residency?**

Acceptable documents include a current lease, utility bill (gas, electric, or cable), or a valid Pennsylvania Driver's License showing your Lemon Hill address.

#### **Will I receive a physical permit for my own vehicle?**

No. Residential permits are virtual. Your vehicle's license plate will be entered into the PPA system and verified digitally by enforcement officers.

#### **Will I receive visitor permits?**

Yes. Each household may receive up to two (2) physical visitor day passes for guests or service vehicles during the 39-day festival period. They will be mailed to the address provided in your online application.

#### **What if I do not own a vehicle?**

Residents without a vehicle may still receive two visitor day passes, provided they submit acceptable proof of residency.

#### **Can Fan Festival visitors park on neighborhood streets?**

No. General parking for the Fan Festival is prohibited at Lemon Hill. Attendees are being directed to use public transit or rideshare instead.

#### **What happens after July 19?**

Normal enforcement of posted parking regulations will resume, and the temporary parking permits will no longer be valid.
